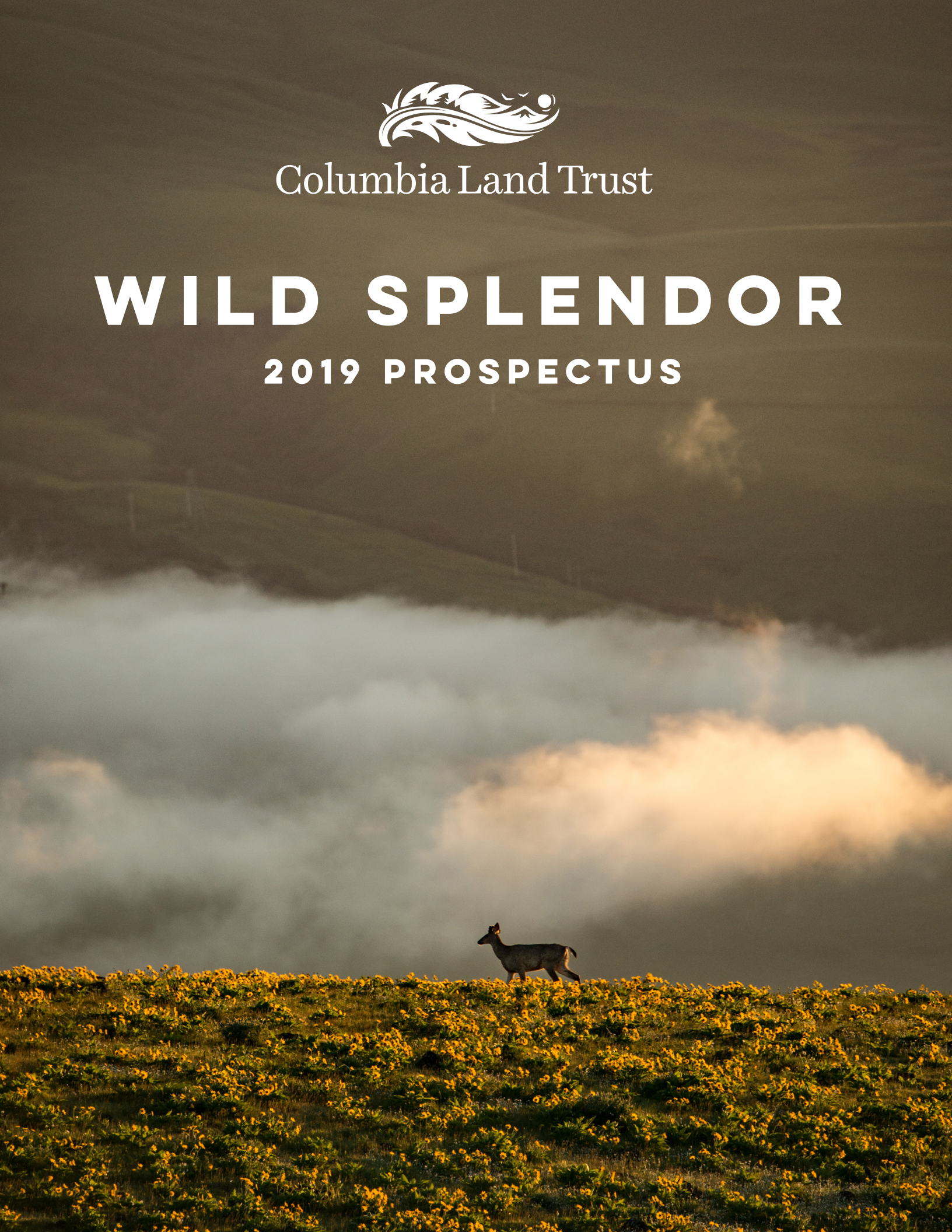

ABOUT COLUMBIA LAND TRUST

Columbia Land Trust has been working to protect the vibrant lands, waters, and wildlife of the Pacific Northwest for nearly 30 years. To date, we have conserved over 43,000 acres and are supported by nearly 5,000 donor households. Our work covers two states (Oregon and Washington) and 15,000 square miles around the Columbia River and its many tributaries.

However, threats to our vision of a thriving, nature-rich Northwest are real – species are going extinct at record rates, our air and water is often fouled, and our climate is undergoing dramatic change. Our response now will play a critical role in determining what kind of world our future generations will inherit.

Fortunately, across our diverse human communities we share common values in support of nature. People of the Pacific Northwest take a special pride in knowing and caring for nature. Columbia Land Trust is one of the Northwest's leading conservation groups, mobilizing people to conserve nature, from backyards to our farms, forests, and wild places.





FEARLESS CONSERVATION

In 2017, Columbia Land Trust adopted a Conservation Agenda that offers a framework for conserving the Northwest nature we love in the next 25 years. The agenda shows how we can unite people from diverse communities across five distinct ecoregions in the Columbia River region to accomplish conservation that will have lasting impacts on the places we live, work, and play.

The Land Trust's strategies outlined in the conservations agenda are designed to raise \$100 million for conservation and to engage thousands of people from 2017-2020. Support from our corporate sponsors through our events provides the very foundation for these strategies. We leverage your funds to build relationships, write grants, secure donated land, and recruit thousands of volunteer conservationists. On average, we raise \$20 for every \$1 you give.
