The Backyard Habitat Certification Program Manager is responsible for directing and overseeing the Backyard Habitat Certification Program for the organization.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Program Development and Management

- Develops and implements regional urban conservation recommendations and resources to smaller scale urban properties. Focus areas include invasive weeds, native plants, pesticide reduction, stormwater management, and wildlife stewardship.
- Hire, train and supervise Backyard Habitat Technicians (contractors) who provide up to 600
 yearly initial site assessments for all new applicants to the program.
- Coordinate with supervisor and local and regional stakeholders to develop and implement longrange strategic planning of the program.
- Works with Development Director and program partners to develop program budget. Oversees program budget; reports progress or variances to Development Director and internal and external stakeholders.
- Work with program partner to develop annual fundraising plan for program. Provide support to write and review grants; tracks grant management and metrics for particular projects/budgets.
- Coordinate the Backyard Habitat Landscape Directory through recruitment, training, and oversight of these companies.

Outreach

- Performs community outreach efforts including presentations, attending neighborhood association meetings, meetings with agency staff, creating newsletter content and announcements, sending messages, and information through social media channels.
- Displays excellent communication skills including presentation, persuasion, and negotiation skills required in working with contractors, political figures, agencies, stakeholders, and co-workers. Includes the ability to communicate effectively and remain calm and courteous under pressure.
- Manage and solicit a portfolio of prospective donors who are participants with the Backyard Habitat Program
- Respectfully takes direction from Development Director.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Supervisory responsibilities for the Backyard Habitat Technicians
- Manages the work flow and processes of volunteers, contractors, and other partners/resources, as required.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE

- Bachelor's degree in biology or ecology from four-year college or university
- 3-5 years of related experience in environmental education, and conservation science within a natural resources field or equivalent combination of education and experience.

The salary for this position will be \$54,000 - \$58,000 per year, depending on experience.
