Her fellow prosecuting attorneys included former governor Gary Locke, and US District Court Judges Marsha Pechman, Robert Lasnik and Richard Jones. Four years later, she moved to Vancouver, WA and entered private practice. Six years later, she received encouragement from her peers to pursue an open seat on the bench and was appointed by Governor Booth Gardner in 1987. She was the first female judge in the history of Clark County Superior Court. Judge Johnson is a member of the Vancouver Rotary and has served on many volunteer boards and commissions.
