Summary

The **Fire and Fuels Technician** will support forest health and community resilience through prescribed fire, fuels reduction, and mechanical treatments across conserved lands. This position works as part of a collaborative stewardship team managing fire-adapted forests. The role combines physically demanding fieldwork with adaptive management, cross-boundary partnerships, and stewardship support in a fast-paced, mission-driven environment.

Essential Duties:

- Support planning, permitting, and implementation of prescribed fire, fuels reduction, and ecological restoration projects in collaboration with Natural Area Managers.
- Prepare treatment areas by laying out mechanical units and prescribed fire control lines.
- Conduct mechanical thinning, slash piling, pile burning, and broadcast prescribed burning using hand tools, chainsaws, pumps, hoses, and other fire equipment.
- Assist with organizing and leading prescribed fire operations, including equipment staging, crew

coordination, and on-site decision-making.

- Provide field oversight and direction for contractors, stewardship staff, volunteers, and project partners.
- Implement post-treatment and post-burn rehabilitation activities, including erosion control, invasive species management, native seeding, and maintenance of fences, signs, and small structures.
- Coordinate field logistics, equipment, materials, and follow-up tasks to ensure safe and efficient project delivery.
- Document field work, treatment outcomes, and site observations using databases and Geographic Information Systems (GIS).
- Maintain fire and stewardship tools, equipment, and vehicles in safe, organized, and fire-ready condition.
- Participate in cooperative prescribed fire efforts and partnerships, including the Mt. Adams Prescribed Burn Association.
- Support stewardship program planning, grant development, reporting, and administrative tasks.
- Engage professionally with neighbors and community members and work safely in remote environments.

Qualifications

Columbia Land Trust seeks applicants with skills and experience in some of the listed tasks or similar work. Training will be provided to ensure qualified candidates can safely and effectively perform the job. Accommodation may be available for individuals with disabilities to enable them to fulfill essential job functions.

Required Skills & Experience

The following are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability needed to perform the duties of the job. Some experience with one or more of the following is preferred, with some training available to help build existing skills to reach the skill level needed. Both professional and personal life experience will be considered.

- High school diploma and four years of experience working on prescribed fire or wildland fire suppression assignments; OR Bachelor's degree in related field such as forestry, fire, natural resource management, etc., and two years of experience working on prescribed fire or wildland fire suppression assignments.
- Experience using fire suppression equipment and tools, including engines, pumps, hoses, backpack sprayers, weather monitoring instruments, and hand tools.
- Ability to learn how to safely operate a UTV on the fire line.
- Ability to work at times alone under physically or mentally demanding conditions such as steep terrain, remote locations, challenging weather, fire, heavy smoke, and natural hazards.
- Occasional travel overnight in remote settings independently.
- Ability to carry and operate a chainsaw safely for more than four hours a day, multiple days a week.
- Competency with common computer programs including Microsoft Office applications, and aptitude for learning new technological devices and programs.
- Ability to keep organized records and write clearly and effectively for record keeping, permit and grant applications or reporting, and operational communications.
- A genuine enthusiasm for conservation and management of fire-adapted forests, and particularly for the mission, goals, and values of Columbia Land Trust.
- Ability and willingness to safely apply herbicides.
- An ability to work productively with people from cultural, economic, and socially diverse backgrounds.

Preferred Skills and Experience

- FFT2 or higher National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) certifications.
- Familiarity with Type 6 fire engines. Ability to troubleshoot and make basic repairs of mechanical equipment including sprayers, pumps, and saws.
- S212 or equivalent chainsaw training certification.
- Knowledge of ecological forestry concepts, particularly dry, fire-adapted forest systems, silvicultural systems, and plant identification.
- Wilderness First Responder or other field medical training.
- Ability to create basic maps and edit attribute tables in ArcGIS online or ArcPro.

Salary and Benefits

Columbia Land Trust offers a competitive salary, a comprehensive benefits package, and a supportive and positive work environment. The full salary range for this position is \$55,043-\$71,557 annually. Based on our internal equity review and candidate's qualifications, the estimated starting salary will be \$55,043 - \$59,172 annually, depending on qualifications and experience.
